A POSSIBLE ECUMENICAL EXERCISE

Preparing couples for marriage is a key responsibility that falls to the various Christian traditions. An interesting and informative activity that churches of various backgrounds might undertake when they gather is to share what they require of couples who request to get married. Indeed, the marriage preparation process of the Catholic Church calls for a lot from those couples who want their marriage to be recognized by the Catholic Church.

First, it needs to be stressed that all baptized Catholics who intend to marry need to participate in the Catholic Church's marriage preparation process if their marriage is to be recognized by the Catholic Church.

In its marriage preparation process, the Catholic Church clearly sets forth its understanding of the goal and purposes of marriage. The ultimate goal of marriage is the eternal salvation of both persons in a given marriage. We are not saved in a vacuum. We experience powerful ways something of the Lord's redeeming love in our relationships with one another. Of all human relationships, that of marriage is most personal and intense. A husband and wife have a profound influence over each other. The Church wants to do all that it can to promote marriage relationships that lead the persons in them closer to the Lord. In regard to our relationship with the Lord, there is nothing neutral about marriage. Each given marriage will either lead the persons in that marriage closer to the Lord or farther away from the Lord.

For our lives in this world, marriage has been designed and instituted by the Lord as that unique relationship in which a man and a woman make a total, faithful and permanent commitment to each other. It is essential that this commitment to be open to having children where this is possible. For this reason, the possibility for the Church to recognize same-sex intimate relationships as sacramental marriage is out of the question. Same sex intimate relationships simply cannot bring forth children, an essential possibility that has been designed only for the intimate relationship between a man and a woman.

The Church insists that persons whose marriages it is to recognize be free to marry. Before individuals who have experienced the trauma of divorce can enter into a marriage that would be recognized by the Catholic Church, they need to explore the possibility of having the consent that they expressed at the time of their former weddings declared null and void by a marriage Tribunal of the Catholic Church. Only with this declaration of nullity can a person who has gone through a prior marriage ceremony be free to marry in the Catholic Church.

As goes the quality of marriages, so goes the quality of life in the Church and in the world. Marriage is the Lord-instituted setting for raising a family. By the Lord's design, family life is meant to be an expression of the Church in miniature. In this setting, the love of husband and wife mirrors and reflects the love between Christ and His Church. Through the example of the love that they have for each other and by practicing the Faith of the Church in a proactive manner, parents equip the children who are entrusted to them to want to find the Lord's rightful place for themselves in this world as adults.

It is because of this awesome role of marriage in the Lord's plan for the development of the Church and that of the larger human community that the Catholic Church has developed the challenging but rewarding marriage preparation process that it sets forth.
